#### PROJECT SUMMERY

The project is Man Ray; a website which shows his innovative passion for photography leaving an everlasting imprint on artists all over the world. The main purpose of the website is to introduce/educate art students on his achievements and influences; particularly photography majors.

#### Pages include:

**Homepage**:- menu content (biography, timeline, gallery, contact.)

**Biography**:- views, accomplishments, and influences.

Timeline:- important dates in the artist's life.

**Gallery**:- Each of these pages will have a description of subject and date it was created. First: earlier piece. Second: a key developmental image. Third: one of his most innovative pieces. Fouth: a mysterious figure (a more developed Man Ray).

**Contact**: A contact form to submit by the user. Another option is the simple link to the name and email address of author.

#### **DESIGN SUMMERY**

Using an asymmetrical design, the site will have a design emphasis on visual hierarchy and negative space used in a positive way while keeping a balance between elements. Text will be used as a visual element; part of the design, to stipulate the viewer and catch his/her attention.

The overall look will be black and white mostly; conveying the style the artist created which a classic Hollywood film environment; sometimes mysterious, sometimes lustful, sometimes somber and sometimes very imaginary and creative.

The fonts chosen will have to portray the mood the art work is created in. The fonts; Lithos Pro and Franklin Gothic Demi, will have a great impact as to whether the design works or not because all the elements should have visual unity.


#### **AUDIENCE PROFILE**

#### **BIOGRAPHY**

Man Ray was born Emmanuel Radnitsky (or Radnitzky) in 1890 in Philadelphia, but his family later moved to Brooklyn and shortened their name to Ray.

Not wishing to be pigeonholed by his ethnic background, the young Ray abbreviated Emmanuel (or 'Manny') to Man - which could hardly be more universal. Visits to shows at Stieglitz's 291 Gallery and elsewhere introduced Man Ray to modern art and he attended various classes around New York while making a living as a graphic artist.

In New York, Ray met and worked with the French artist Marcel Duchamp (site in French, with good illustrations) and Francis Picabia from Spain, forming the core of the New York Dada movement whose centre was Alfred Stieglitz's gallery '291'. Ray largely abandoned the use of brushes in his paintings, preferring the machine-like quality of the airbrush, used with cut stencils. He also took up photography, at first to produce prints of his own work.


